## **Hillside Estate Winery**

2006 Muscat Ottonel (Okanagan Valley)

British Columbia's only Muscat Ottonel, this has been Hillside's flagship white wine almost since the winery opened in 1990. Bill and Kathy Carpenter, the winery's third set of proprietors, grow enough on the Naramata Road estate vineyard to produce about 1,000 cases a year (plus a modest quantity of late harvest dessert wine). The winery likely has capped the production of this variety because the Carpenters recently grafted some Muscat vines over to Malbec and Petit Verdot.

Carpenter notes that this is one of the few varieties where the wine echoes the flavour of the fresh grapes. Hillside winemaker Kelly

Symonds preserves the fresh fruit flavour with very cool (about 5C) fermentations.

This aromatic wine begins with fresh floral aromas, recalling rose petals and spice. It charms the palate with mouth filling flavours of spicy apricot and pear, lifted by a delicate touch of residual sweetness. But the wine is well balanced, with a refreshing, crisp finish. 89 points.
