

# **Howling Bluff Estate Wines**

# 2006 Sauvignon Blanc, *Summa Quies Vineyard* (Okanagan Valley)

This is the inaugural wine from Howling Bluff, the newest winery on the Naramata Bench, owned by partners Luke Smith and Toni Chase. The driving force is Smith, a stockbroker who runs that business from his home in the vineyard. The markets close at 1 p.m. Pacific time, leaving Smith long afternoons and evenings to work the 7.3 acre vineyard.

This wine comes an just over an acre of Sauvignon Blanc (the other plantings are primarily red varieties), farmed stingily to produce two tons an acre of fruit. Consulting winemaker Garron Elmes fermented the wine in stainless steel, producing only 130 cases. The wine is very

much in the style of Graves: crisp, lean, flinty, with aromas and tastes of citrus and minerals. The tangy acidity lifts the fruit flavours while the finish is dry. 87 points.
