

WINE RECOMMENDATION



Inniskillin Okanagan Vineyards Winery

2005 Chenin Blanc, *McIntyre Bluff* (Okanagan Valley)

Less than 20 acres of Chenin Blanc are grown in the Okanagan. A large block is in Vincor Canada's McIntyre Bluff Vineyard near Oliver. All of the grapes are now destined for Inniskillin Okanagan's Discovery Series, where winemaker Sandor Mayer made 500 cases in 2005. With the vines now fully in production, Mayer was able to make 2,000 cases the following year, making Inniskillin one of the largest of the Okanagan's three Chenin Blanc producers.

This is a superb example of Chenin Blanc, beginning with aromas of peaches and apricots, all in a tropical fruit salad. On the palate, there are flavours of apricots and mango. The texture of the wine is generous, with mineral notes

and with a crisp acidity, leading to a long, lingering finish. 89 points.
