


WINE RECOMMENDATION



Boyd Family Vineyard

2005 Syrah, Big Ranch Vineyard
(Oak Knoll District of Napa Valley)

Stan and Joan Boyd planted their Big Ranch Vineyard in 1999 to Bordeaux varieties Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Malbec, and Merlot. The Phelps-clone Syrah was admittedly an after thought. The vineyard is located in the highly regarded Oak Knoll District AVA, known for its clay soils and relatively cool temperatures. The Boyd's primary business still is selling fruit to premium wineries (95

percent of what they grow is sold), but they produces small lots of own-labeled wine including this brilliant Syrah.

Bright, opaque purple, and very viscous with colored legs, the wine looks just like it should for a young, healthy Syrah. Perfumed and spicy with aromas of jasmine tea, pink rose, orange blossom, cinnamon, red licorice, menthol, and dark cherry, this wine is softly seductive and speaks volumes on varietal character.

On the palate this gorgeous red is round and silky, with the "gras" of Cote Rotie or Grand Cru red Burgundy. Spicy oak notes along with fruity notes of raspberry, boysenberry, red dots, grape lifesaver, cherry cola, and warming notes of green peppercorns and cinnamon round out the wine. The finish is long and fruity.
