Christine Andrew Vineyards

2005 Chardonnay (Sonoma County)

Since 1989 John and Gail Kautz have been producing wines in Murphys, California under their Ironstone Vineyards label. The

winery, visitor's center, and estate vineyards are located there on part of Gail's family ranch. Along with their four children and winemaker Steve Millier they produce wines across a broad spectrum of brands including Leaping Horse Vineyards, Sonoma Creek, Dog Tail Vineyards, and this new line (May 2007 release), Christine Andrew, named after the great grandchildren from the family's fourth generation. Priced between \$12 and \$15, the line includes this Chardonnay.

Bright yellow gold and viscous, this inviting wine has aromas of butter pecan ice cream, pear tart, butterscotch, maple, vanilla, and honey. On the palate it is sweet and ripe with notes of watermelon, lemon-lime, maple, and toasty oak. The mid-palate is very juicy and full and sweet oak notes stand out on the long finish.
